It can be hard being a student in Wollongong. Study, rent and living costs are high and it can be difficult to manage your budget all the time. Your student association is here to help make your life off campus as easy as possible. Come to WUSA for help with:

Centrelink advice: get help with Youth Allowance, Austudy, Abstudy and Rent Assistance claims.

Legal advice: trouble with the law? WUSA can provide you with advice on most legal issues.

Tenancy Advice: WUSA's caseworkers can advise you on your rights as a tenant and problems with your landlord.

Loans: \$25 emergency loan to help out when things go wrong.

✓ YOUR STUDY

It isn't always easy to deal with university bureaucracy. The students' association provides advocates and assistance for students who are encountering difficulties in their studies.

Academic Appeals: don't think you're being marked fairly? WUSA caseworkers can help you appeal to the university.

Show Cause: In danger of failing uni? WUSA can help you stay enrolled.

Harassment and Discrimination: being targeted because of your race, gender, sexuality or disability? WUSA can help make sure you get a fair go on campus.

WUSA Representatives are directly elected by all students each year to stand up for students' rights on campus and in the wider community. WUSA also provides open collectives and forums whereby everyone can get involved in campaigns to fight for students' rights. WUSA is currently campaigning on such issues as:

Youth Allowance: WUSA is part of an ongoing campaign to raise Youth Allowance above the poverty line and make the payment accessible to all students who need it.

Course Cuts: WUSA has always campaigned against course cuts and faculty closures.
