



ANNUAL GENERAL ELECTION

In accordance with Section 4.6 of the Constitution of the University of Wollongong Undergraduate Students' Association (WUSA), related Regulations Governing Elections and Regulations covering Code of Conduct, the Annual General Elections of WUSA shall be held by way of electronic election from:

9am Wednesday 8 October 2008 until 5pm Friday 10 October 2008

Voting will be conducted on-line through SOLS. Access to on-line voting will be available continuously from 9am Wednesday 8 October 2008 until 5pm Friday 10 October 2008. Voters will be able to seek assistance from a Help Desk during business hours (9am till 5pm) on the days on which voting is open.

In accordance with Section 4.3 of the WUSA Constitution, the following positions shall be elected by and from the eligible undergraduate students of the University at the Annual General Election. Section 4.6.6 of the Constitution details the qualifications required for specific positions. The following positions are to be contested at the 2008 election:

President	Women's Representative
Honorary Secretary	Environment Representative
Honorary Treasurer	International Students Representative
Event Coordinator	Disabilities Representative
Education Campaigns Coordinator	Global Solidarity Officer
Media Coordinator	External Students Representative
Welfare Coordinator	

In addition to the above, fourteen (14) positions for General Representatives of WUSA will be elected by and from the eligible students of the University at the Annual General Elections.

There will also be an election of five (5) NUS Delegates in accordance with National Union of Students Constitution and Regulations for the election of NUS Delegates from the University of Wollongong campus.

In accordance with Section 4.1 of the Regulations Covering Elections, **nominations will open at 9am on Wednesday 10 September 2008.** To be a candidate in the WUSA Annual General Elections, you must be an enrolled undergraduate student at the University of Wollongong at the close of nominations and must satisfy the criteria of undergraduate student as per Part 4 Section 14 of the University By-Law (2005). This is with the exception of discrete honours program students, who are eligible to participate in the WUPA Annual General Election. **Nominations will close at 5pm on Wednesday 24 September 2008.**

Nominations must be made in writing using the Nomination Form. Nomination Forms will be available from Wednesday, 10 September 2008 from <http://www.uow.edu.au/governance/>, or from the Policy and Governance Unit (located in the Academic Registrar's Division Ground Floor, Administration Building 36), or from the WUSA office (located in Building 11).

Nominations must be signed by two eligible undergraduate students of the University and must also contain the consent of the candidate. Candidate Statements and photographs may accompany the nomination but must be in the format detailed on the Nomination Form.

Nominations are to be lodged with the Returning Officer, or a Deputy Returning Officer in the Policy and Governance Unit (located in the Academic Registrar's Division, Ground Floor, Administration Building 36), or a Deputy Returning Officer located in the WUSA offices in Building 11. Nominations may also be faxed to (02) 4221 3295 but must be received by the Returning Officer or a Deputy Returning Officer no later than the time and date specified for the close of nominations.

Candidate Statements and photographs should be emailed to the Returning Officer at vicm@uow.edu.au by no later than the time and date specified for the close of nominations. This applies for individual nominations as well as for the option of completing registration of a Group Ticket.

Candidates are advised that copies of the WUSA Constitution, Regulations Governing Elections, Position Descriptions and Code of Conduct are available from the WUSA Office.
